EVANGELISM

"We are driven to action daily with the knowledge that three billion people do not know our Savior. Our passion in life, our unquenchable desire, is to take God's love to them."⁵

We have been given the greatest cure know to mankind. Jesus Christ has given us the cure for sin by paying for our sin and giving us a relationship with Him. The Definition of Evangelism

Evangelism is "taking the initiative to share Christ (Ephesians 6:19-20, Mark 16:15) in the power of the Holy Spirit (Acts 1:8) and leaving the results to God (1 Corinthians 3:6-7)."⁶
